Ramsar site following the country's recent accession to the Ramsar Convention.

However, sensitive and ecologically important areas of Socotra are currently threatened by uncontrolled development, in particular the proposal to construct a new road system. The scale and construction of many new roads is inappropriate, given the sensitive nature of the Socotran ecosystem. If these roads are built they will seriously impact on the island's wildlife and especially its unique plants and birds. Nineteen bird species of conservation concern could be affected because of the likely destruction of breeding habitat and nest sites. These include Jouanin's Petrel Bulweria fallax, Island Cisticola Cisticola haesitatus, Socotra Warbler Incana incana, Socotra Starling Onychognathus frater, Socotra Sunbird Nectarinia balfouri, Golden-winged Grosbeak Rhynchostruthus

socotranus and Socotra Bunting Emberiza socotrana.

"It is essential that this proposed road building programme is examined carefully by the Yemen Government before it seriously affects Socotra's fragile and internationally renowned environment", said Richard Porter, one of the authors of a report on the roads recently sent to the President of Yemen by BirdLife International and the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh.

BirdLife is calling on the government of Yemen to build only essential roads that are beneficial for local communities, in a way that is sensitive to the environment. In addition, the cost saving would be enormous, allowing much needed small-scale local development, and there would be far less impact on wildlife and the island's increasingly important ecotourism.

ARMENIA

A new trip report from Armenia and Georgia is available for download at the Birdquest http://www.birdquest.co.uk/ website: tripreports.cfm?trip=637. Several Black Francolins Francolinus francolinus were heard in May in southern Syunik province. At Lake Sevan, around 40 Greylag Geese Anser anser with juveniles (with some in Shirak province too) were seen in May, and a probable Lesser White-fronted Goose Anser erythropus was also present in May. During Apr and May around 40 Eurasian Wigeons Anas penelope were at Lake Sevan. At least 15 White-headed Ducks Oxyura leucocephala were seen in Ararat province during May and a total of seven Eurasian Spoonbills Platalea leucorodia were seen in Ararat and Shirak provinces during

the same month. In Shirak province during Apr, an immature **Dalmatian Pelican** Pelecanus crispus and two Cinereous Vultures Aegypius monachus were also recorded. Two breeding pairs of Common Crane Grus grus were observed throughout Apr and May in Shirak province, two Eurasian Oystercatchers Haematopus ostralegus were in Ararat province during May, three Grey Plovers Pluvialis squatarola were seen in May in Ararat province and Lake Sevan and over 600 Black-tailed Godwits Limosa limosa were counted in the same area during May. At Lake Sevan, a single Bar-tailed Godwit Limosa lapponica was recorded in May and a total of eight Whimbrels Numenius phaeopus were seen in Apr and May and at least 20 Marsh Sandpipers Tringa stagnatilis were present in Apr. During May around 15 Terek Sandpipers Xenus cinereus, over 50 Spotted Redshanks Tringa erythropus and two Broadbilled Sandpipers Limicola falcinellus were counted in Ararat province. At Lake Sevan during May there was a flock of Blackwinged Pratincoles Glareola nordmanni, a Lesser Black-backed Gull Larus fuscus, a Mediterranean Gull Larus melanocephalus and a Little Gull L. minutus. Six Gull-billed Terns Sterna nilotica were seen in Apr at Lake Sevan and five were recorded in May in Ararat province. A flock of c100 Whiskered Terns Chlidonias hybrida and a flock of c400 Whitewinged Terns C. leucopterus and a Eurasian Eagle Owl Bubo bubo were recorded at Lake Sevan during Jun. A Great Grey Shrike Lanius excubitor of the nominate race was seen in Jan in Ararat province. Two pairs of Trumpeter Finch Bucanetes githagineus were found at a new breeding site in May in southern Syunik province.

BAHRAIN

A **Corncrake** *Crex crex* was reported at Anwaj Islands on 8 May; this species was last recorded in 1991. On 1 May a **Eurasian Stone-curlew** *Burhinus oedicnemus* with two chicks was observed between Al Jazair beach and the horse endurance centre and represents a first breeding record for this species if confirmed. A pair of **Hypocolius** *Hypocolius ampelinus* were on sale at Isa Town market on 6 May but before the birds could be recovered the seller had disappeared. Isa Town is the other side of the Island to the known roosts and this might indicate an unknown roosting area for the species.

CYPRUS

Records of four **Mute Swans** *Cygnus olor* at Potamos Liopetri on 15 Jan and three at Zakaki marsh on 19 Jan were the first records since January 2006. There were two **Marbled Ducks** *Marmaronetta angustirostris* at Larnaca sewage works on 25–26 Jun; this species was a former breeder early in the 20th century and this is only the 5th Cyprus record since 1958. The last record was of 6 birds at the Akrotiri salt lake in Apr 1992. On 25 Apr there was a **Merlin** *Falco columbarius* at Larnaca salt lake and on 4 Apr there was a **Black-winged Kite**

Elanus caeruleus at Mazotos which will be the third record if accepted. Eighteen Pallid Harriers Circus macrourus arriving off the sea on 24 Mar was exceptional and a Levant Sparrowhawk Accipiter brevipes at Cape Greco on 25 Apr was the 10th record since 1998. Up to two Baillon's Crakes Porzana pusilla at Aspro dam pools 24-29 Apr was the 12th record since 1998 and around 30 Demoiselle Cranes Anthropoides virgo flew over Phasouri reed-beds at dawn on 26 Mar. A White-tailed Lapwing Vanellus leucurus at Phasouri reedbeds on 12 Mar was only the 10th record since April 2000 and 13 Eurasian Dotterels Charadrius morinellus in Larnaca airport fields on 12 Apr was the 10th record since 1998. On 27 Mar a Cream-coloured Courser Cursorius cursor was seen inside the Paphos airport fence. A maximum of seven Great Blackheaded Gulls Larus ichthyaetus arrived at Larnaca sewage works on 5 Mar, the largest group ever recorded. Previous high number was six in March 1995. A Little Swift Apus affinis reported at Phasouri reed-beds on 2 Apr will be the 10th record if accepted. Two Yellow-billed Choughs Pyrrhocorax graculus were seen over the summit of Mount Olympus on 20 Apr, and will be the first record for Cyprus if accepted. There is one old unsubstantiated report of two birds over the Kyrenia range in Northern Cyprus in April 1987. A Rook Corvus frugilegus was recorded at Fresh Water Lakes, Famagusta on 28 Feb-28 Mar and one at Konia on 29 Mar were the sixth and seventh records in recent years. A Blyth's Reed Warbler Acrocephalus dumetorum mist-netted and ringed on 25 Apr at Polis reed-beds is likely to be accepted as the first record for Cyprus and a Green Warbler Phylloscopus trochiloides nitidus seen on the Adonis trail in the Akamas on 14 Apr is under assessment as a first record. The eleventh Asian Desert Warbler Sylvia nana for Cyprus was at Oroklini marsh on 28-31 Dec and single Rufous-tailed Scrub Robins Cercotrichas galactotes were at Cape Greco on 2 Apr, Agia Napa sewage works on 4 Apr and Evretou dam on 17 Apr. Two very rare wheatears were recorded in March, with a Rufous-tailed Wheatear Oenanthe xanthoprymna at Agia Napa sewage works area 12-14th Mar (fourth record) and a White-crowned Wheatear O. leucopyga at Polis 6-10 March (seventh record). A female Hooded Wheatear O. monacha at Cape Pyla on 31 Mar-1 Apr was the 14th record in recent years. It was a good spring for Collared Flycatchers Ficedula albicollis with 74 records of 140 birds reported and Semi-collared Flycatchers F. semitorquata were seen at Paphos headland on 17 Apr, one ringed at Agios Minas the following day and one at South Nicosia on 20 Apr. A Pale Rockfinch Carpospiza brachydactyla at Aspro dam pools on 25 Mar, with another there on 5 Apr, constitute the 12th & 13th records. The fourth record of Rock Sparrow Petronia petronia involved up to 30 birds feeding on ground with finches and Corn Buntings Emberiza calandra in Marathounta hills above Paphos from 14-19 Feb. Previous records include a caged bird and a bird found dead. There was also a small influx of Trumpeter Finches Bucanetes githagineus with one at Agia Napa 26 Mar, one at Timi Beach 11 Apr, one at Paphos lighthouse 12-13 Apr and two at Phasouri reed-beds 15 Apr. There have been just 18 previous records. A Cinereous Bunting Emberiza cineracea at Anarita Park, near Paphos on 20 Mar was the first since 2005 and only the 12th record in 10 years. It was also a good year for Rock Buntings E. cia with one found above Belapais, Kyrenia on 5 Feb and another was seen near Vufavento, in mountains east of Kyrenia on 6 Feb; these are the first reports since 2004.

EGYPT

On 27 Apr, 16 Sand Partridges Ammoperdix heyi were at St Katherine's Monastery, Sinai. Three immature Greater White-fronted Geese Anser albifrons arrived in Nabq Bay, Sharm el-Sheikh from the north-east on 17 Jan and quickly adapted to the heavily disturbed resort area, feeding at a mini football pitch behind the beach early morning and were still present 27 Jan. A count of c180 Ferruginous Ducks Aytha nyroca was made on the River Nile north of Edfu on 28 Feb and c65 were at Kitchener's Island, Aswan on 2 Mar. A Sooty Shearwater Puffinus griseus was off Hurghada on 23 Apr and five Yellow-billed Storks Mycteria ibis were at Abu Simbel on 17 Apr, two Goliath Herons Ardea goliath at Wadi Lahami on 22 Jan and two Pink-backed

Pelicans Pelecanus rufescens at Abu Simbel on 17 Apr. Two Brown Boobies Sula leucogaster were at Hamata pier on 21 Jan, with one at Wadi Gimal on the same day and four off Hurghada on 23 Apr. Four pairs of Lanner Falcons Falco biarmicus were between Hurghada and El Shalatein on the 21 Jan, a Barbary Falcon Falco pelegrinoides was at Hurghada on 24 Jan and just one Lappetfaced Vulture Aegypius trachielotos on the outskirts of El Shalatein on 21 Jan. Two Eastern Imperial Eagles Aquila heliaca (immature and juvenile) were over Wadi Mandar on 23 Jan and juvenile at Sharm el-Sheikh/Naama Bay sewage farm on 24 Jan. An African Swamphen Porphyrio madagascariensis was found at Ain Sukhna, Suez on 17 Mar and two Demoiselle Cranes Anthropoides virgo were at Abu Ramad near Gebel Elba on 1 Apr. On 28 Feb a White-tailed Lapwing Vanellus leucurus was just south of Edfu, fifteen Greater Painted Snipes Rostratula benghalensis at Abassa fish-ponds on 6 Apr and two Creamcoloured Coursers Cursorius cursor were south of Ain Sukhna two days later. Ten Sooty Gulls Larus hemprichii were on Cifton Island on 12 Apr and three African Skimmers Rynchops flavirostris were on the River Nile north of Edfu on 28 Feb. At Hurghada, a Namaqua Dove Oena capensis was seen on 24 Jan. A female Hypocolius Hypocolius ampelinus was seen at close range in the gardens of the Movenpick Resort Hotel at El Quseir on the Red Sea coast on 14 Feb and later in the day a male was seen at the same place. An Oriental Skylark Alauda gulgula was found at 'Sinai Golf City', Nabq Bay, Sharm el-Sheikh on 15 Jan, a White-spectacled Bulbul Pycnonotus xanthopygos was in St. Catherine's Monastery garden in Naqb Bay on 25 Jan and an African Desert Warbler Sylvia deserti was just north of Hamata pier on 22 Jan. On 26 Jan two Fieldfares Turdus pilaris were seen in Nabq Bay, a Black Scrub Robin Cercotrichas podobe was seen at El Gouna on 14 Mar and a Siberian Stonechat Saxicola maurus was at Hurghada on 24 Jan. An immature Nile Valley Sunbird Anthodiaeta metallica was at Hurghada on 24 Jan, 15 Red Avadavats Amandava subflava were on Crocodile Island, Luxor, on 25 Feb and two Indian Silverbills Lonchura malabarica were nest-building in the grounds of the Movenpick Hotel, Ciza, on 23–24 Feb. A flock of five **Siberian Buff-bellied Pipits** *Anthus rubescens japonica* were found in Naqb Bay golf course on 15–16 Jan, with at least 4 there until 26th; one was at Sharm el-Sheikh/Naama Bay sewage farm 19 Jan, one Naqb Bay pond 20 Jan, one calling over hotel gardens, Naqb Bay on 27 Jan and one was at Abassa fish-ponds on 6 Apr. Also in Nabq Bay, a **Long-billed Pipit** *Anthus similis* was found on the golf course on 26 Jan.

ISRAEL

There was an influx of c20 Mute Swans Cugnus olor into Northern Israel in Jan and four Velvet Scoters Melanitta fusca seen off Jaffa on 31 Jan represents the seventh record for Israel. Two Goldeneye Bucephala clangula at Meizar reservoir, Golan Heights, on 8-10 Feb were the first in Israel since 1990 and four Smew Mergellus albellus were seen at Bnei Yisrael reservoir, Golan Heights, from 18 Apr. There were two notable seabird records, with a Streaked Shearwater Calonectris leucomelas off Eilat north beach on 14 May (fourth record) and a Swinhoe's Petrel Oceanodroma monorhis found dead at Eilat on 24 Jan (fifth record). All previous records of the latter species have also been found dead or dying at Eilat, the last in September 2004. The first-ever winter record of a Crested Honey Buzzard Pernis ptilorhyncus in Israel involved a bird that lingered at Eilat from Feb to 25 Mar at least. The ninth Black-winged Kite Elanus caeruleus for Israel was at Kfar Ruppin, Bet She'an Valley, on 29-30 Dec and one in the N Arava valley on 5 Apr is the tenth record. The seventh Bateleur Terathopius ecaudatus for Israel flew over Eilat on 28 Mar and a Verreaux's Eagle Aquila verreauxii was at Ein Gedi on 21 Jun. On 24-25 Jan the sixth Great Bustard Otis tarda for Israel was at Kanaf, Golan Heights and a Purple Swamphen Porphyrio madagascariensis was at Ma'agan Michael on 21 Apr. Four Demoiselle Cranes were at Agamon Lake, Hula, with one over Bet Shemesh, Judean Plains, on 15 Mar and a Pacific Golden Plover Pluvialis fulva was at Eilat Km 20 salt-pans on 17 May. Two Caspian Plovers Charadrius asiaticus remained at Yotvata till 28 Mar, one was at Elifaz, S Arava from 3-8 Apr and one was at Ma'agan Michael

on 24 Apr. The sixth record of Pectoral Sandpiper Calidris melanotos was a single at Yotvata sewage ponds from 30 Apr-4 May and the seventh record quickly followed with one at Gesher fishponds, Jordan valley, on 7 May. An Audouin's Gull Larus audouinii was off Jaffa on 19 Feb and a second-summer was off Eilat north beach on 9 May. A pair of Caspian Terns Hydroprogne caspia raising one chick at Eilat during April was the first ever breeding record for Israel. A putative firstsummer male Oriental Cuckoo Cuculus optatus was trapped and ringed at Jerusalem Bird Observatory on 27 April and remained in the area until 5 May (the second for Israel if confirmed; the first was at Eilat in August 1985). Small numbers of Thick-billed Larks Ramphocoris clotbey were in the southern Arava and southern Negev during March and a few, mainly in Hamei-shar, S Negev were present during April and may have been breeding. A Blyth's Pipit Anthus godlewskii at Rishpon, Dan on 13 Mar was the fourth record. There was an influx of c1000 Rosecoloured Starlings Sturnus roseus in the Hula Valley mainly during 11-16 May and there was also a good arrival of White-throated Robins Irania gutturalis in the Arava valley, Eilat and S Negev with c15 around in late Apr and up to 20 until 23 May. A very obliging male Black Scrub Robin Cercotrichas podobe was at Eilat from 28 Mar and was joined by a female from 14 Apr; one at KM 25, S Arava on 21 Jun was a very late record. A Rufous-tailed Wheatear Oenanthe xanthoprymna was at Neot Smadar, S Negev on 6-7 Mar, with another at Rishpon on 13 Mar, there was an influx of eight Pied Wheatears O. pleschanka in S Arava and Eilat during May and eight Cyprus Pied Wheatears O. cypriaca were in the southern Arava during 10-25 Mar. A Basra Reed Warbler Acrocephalus griseldis was reported at Elifaz on 1 Apr and the tiny breeding population returned to the Hula Valley with at least four adults noted during June. On 14 Apr a Blyth's Reed Warbler A. dumetorum was trapped and ringed at Sde Boker, a Booted Warbler Iduna caligata was at Eilat on 12 Mar (fifth record if accepted), the third record of Green Warbler Phylloscopus trochiloides nitidus was trapped and ringed at Sde Boker on 1 May; the previous record being in Aug 2004 and finally the second **Pine Bunting** *Emberiza leucocephalos* for Eilat was there on 3 Apr.

IRAN

Records from a migration watch on the small island of Ashura Deh (at the extreme SE corner of the Caspian Sea) during 4-18 April included 41 Lesser Kestrels Falco naumanni, 113 Common Kestrels F. tinnunculus, 20 Merlins F. columbarius, a first-summer Blackwinged Kite Elanus caeruleus on 17th (probably first for northern Iran), 424 Black Kites Milvus migrans (including 186 on 16th), three Egyptian Vultures Neophron percnopterus, 284 Western Marsh Harriers Circus aeruginosus, 43 Hen Harriers C. cyaneus, 263 Pallid Harriers C. macrourus (Plate 1, including 53 on 5th), 39 Montagu's Harriers C. pygargus, 22 Northern Goshawks Accipiter gentilis, 567 Eurasian Sparrowhawks A. nisus (with 103 on 16th), 167 Steppe Buzzards Buteo b. vulpinus, nine Long-legged Buzzards Buteo rufinus, two Steppe Eagles Aquila nipalensis, two Eastern Imperial Eagles A. heliaca, two Booted Eagles A. pennata, 943 Red-necked

Phalaropes Phalaropus lobatus (including 460 on 16th), a Caspian Plover Charadrius asiaticus (on 8th), also three Great Black-headed Gulls Larus ichthyaetus, up to 470 Slender-billed Gulls Larus genei daily, up to 117 Whiskered Terns Chlidonias hybrida, a Turkestan Isabelline Shrike Lanius isabellinus phoenicuroides (on 6th), 151 Blue-cheeked Bee-eaters Merops persicus, 421 European Bee-eaters M. apiaster, and an Oriental Skylark Alauda gulgula (on 5th), 15 Green Warblers Phylloscopus trochiloides nitidus, at least 20 breeding pairs of Menetries' Warblers Sylvia mystacea, two Common Mynas Acridotheres tristis (on 16th, most likely genuine migrants), eight Isabelline Wheatears Oenanthe isabellina, nine Pied Wheatears O. pleschanka, two Blackeared Wheatears O. hispanica, two hybrid Pied Wheatear x Black-eared Wheatears, three Desert Wheatears O. deserti, up to 15 Red-breasted Flycatchers Ficedula parva daily, up to 30 Citrine Wagtails Motacilla citreola daily, and a Richard's Pipit Anthus richardi (on 15th).

IRAQ

A pair of **Black-winged Kites** *Elanus caeruleus* with a nest was found with four eggs in May (no region given). A visit was made to the border between Turkey and Iraq, between the rivers Ortasu and Zap/Nahr az-Zab, on 13 June 2008. The following are some of the bird species observed on the Iraqi side of the rivulet that forms the state border: European Roller Coracias garrulus (4), European Beeeater Merops apiaster, Sombre Tit Poecile lugubris, Crag Martin Ptyonoprogne rupestris, Red-backed Shrike Lanius collurio, Woodchat Shrike L. senator, Eurasian Golden Oriole Oriolus oriolus, Cetti's Warbler Cettia cetti, Eastern Olivaceous Warbler Iduna pallida, Lesser Whitethroat Sylvia curruca, Blackeared Wheatear Oenanthe hispanica, Blue Rock Thrush Monticola solitarius, and Blackheaded Bunting Emberiza melanocephala.

JORDAN

On 10 Mar, 16 Sand Partridges Ammoperdix heyi were at Wadi Haamra, an adult Eastern Imperial Eagle Aquila heliaca was at Azrag on 11 Mar, c30 Spur-winged Lapwings Vanellus spinosus were at Aqaba sewage works on 15 Mar and c20 Cream-coloured Coursers *Cursorius cursor* were at Shaumari on 11 Mar. At Aquaba, c20 White-eyed Gulls Larus leucophthalmus were recorded on 14 Mar and a first-winter Little Gull L. minutus was there the next day. At least two male Namagua Doves Oena capensis were at Sawayma (Dead Sea) on 2 May and two Hume's Owls Strix butleri were in Dana village on 12 Mar. Two Scrub Warbler Scotocerca inquieta nests found on 29 Apr at Barra Forest, Wadi Dana, each containing a young Cuckoo Cuculus canorus, were very early nests. A male Finsch's Wheatear Oenanthe finschii was at the Panorama View Hotel, Petra on 3 May and the first Siberian Buff-bellied Pipit Anthus rubescens japonica for Jordan was at Aqaba on 7 Jan. Four nests of Syrian Serin Serinus syriacus were found at Barra Forest, Wadi Dana between 29 Mar and 1 May; this is the first time nestlings have been described. On 15 Mar, c25 Desert Finches Rhodospiza obsoletus were at Aqaba and c20 Sinai Rosefinches Carpodacus synoicus were at Petra on 14 Mar, with eight at Wadi Rum the following day.

KAZAKHSTAN

Arend Wassink and Gerald J Oreel have published an extensive list of new and interesting records in Dutch Birding (30: 93-100). The report includes the following records. An adult male White-headed Duck Oxyura leucocephla found on 17 Dec 2007 at Tengiz, Atyrau province was the first winter record. On 22 Dec 2007, 17 Great Cormorants Phalacrocorax carbo and two juvenile Great White Pelicans Pelecanus onocrotalus were found at Sorbulak Lake, Almaty province, again the first winter records for Kazakhstan. Two adult Cattle Egrets Bubulcus ibis found at Tengiz, Atyrau province on 28 May 2006 was the third record (although the species has bred in 1992–93). Four summer-plumaged Lesser Sand Plovers Charadrius mongolus found on 19 May 2006 in the Taukum desert, c25 km from Kolshengel, Almaty province constitutes the eight record. The first breeding of Black Woodpecker Dryocopus martius in western Kazakhstan was documented on 18 Mar and between 31 Mar and 8 Apr 2006, when birds were seen visiting nest holes at Oral (at Kirov park and in the Chagan valley, respectively). A total of four first-winter Collared Flycatchers Ficedula albicollis were trapped at Dzhanybeck in the Volga-Ural semi-desert, West Kazakhstan province on 23 (one), 24 (one) and 28 Aug 2004 (two) and these are the second to fifth records. Of particular interest was a male of the alboides race of White Wagtail Motacilla alba. This form is split by some authors as a full species (Himalayan Wagtail). The bird was photographed on 30 May 2007 at Kaskelen in Almaty province. The paper also reassessed historical records, and Hooded Crane Grus monacha and White-naped Crane Grus vipio are now removed by the authors from their systematic list of the birds of Kazakhstan (published 2007).

KUWAIT

The first **Lesser Frigatebird** *Fregata ariel* for Kuwait (and the first Western Palearctic record away from Israel) was watched for about an hour at Zour port on 10 Apr. A male **Shikra** *Accipiter badius* was at Sulaibikhat on 27 Dec 2007, at Abdali on 5 Jan and at Jahra on 13–18 Jan. An immature **Bonelli's Eagle** *Aquila fasciatus* was at the Pivot Fields on 28

Dec 2007 and an immature at Thula on 2 Jan. Five **Macqueen's Bustards** *Chlamydotis macqueenii* were at Sabah Al-Ahmed on 31 Dec 2007 and 186 **Crab Plovers** were at Doha spit on 20 Mar. At the Pivot Fields, a **Red-wattled Lapwing** *Vanellus indicus* was there from 31 Dec 2007–3 Jan, 17 **Caspian Plovers** *Charadrius asiaticus* were recorded on 27 Mar and the **Little Curlew** *Numenius minutus* remained from 12 Dec 2007 until 29 Jan. An **Indian Roller** *Coracias benghalensis* was at Kuwait University on 1–18 Jan, with two more at Jahra on 1 Jan and the **Long-tailed Shrike** *Lanius schach* remained at Sulaibikhat until April. On 3 Jul there was a **Masked Shrike** *L*. nubicus at CP Buehring. On Green Island there were at least 40 **Hypocoliuses** Hypocolius ampelinus on 16 Mar and five **Red-vented Bulbuls** Pycnonotus cafer there on 1 Jan. Seven **Common Babblers** Turdoides caudata were at Abdaly on 30 Dec 2007, at least 30 **Bank Mynas** Acridotheres ginginianus were at Jahra during Jan and a first-winter female **Darkthroated Thrush** Turdus atrogularis was at the Pivot Fields on 28 Dec 2007. The two immature male **Purple Sunbirds** Cinnyris asiaticus, the first record for Cramp's Western Palearctic, remained at Subiya from 5 Dec 2007 until at least 19 Jan, with three present there on 10–11 Jan (Plates 2&3).

LEBANON

Single Leach's Storm Petrels Oceanodroma leucorhoa were seen at El Mina, Tripoli on 24 and 29 Mar following rough weather in the Mediterranean. Other observations of interest there included Slender-billed Gulls Larus genei on 21 and 22 Mar, and an Arctic Skua Stercorarius parasiticus on 29th. Three Eurasian Wigeons Anas penelope at Aammig marsh on 27 Mar were of note. Visits to the desert region near Ras Baalbek in March and April confirmed the continued presence of three recently discovered breeding species for Lebanon, Scrub Warbler Scotocerca inquieta, Desert Lark Ammomanes deserti and Bar-tailed Lark A. cinctura. Trumpeter Finches Bucanetes githagineus and Cream-coloured Coursers Cursorius cursor were also present in small numbers and an influx of Pale Rockfinch Carpospiza brachydactyla had begun by the April visit. With a modest increase in active birders, Blue Tit Cyanistes caeruleus is proving to be a more widespread breeder than previously thought, records being received from north of Tripoli south as far as Beirut, all along the Mount Lebanon range and its west facing slopes. Bimaculated Larks Melanocorypha bimaculata were found breeding in the Jird area in the far north in May. Following sightings of singing displaying males in April 2006 and 2007 at three different sites in the West Bekaa, European Serins Serinus serinus were seen again at Ksara in April and May, indicating that this species is probably now breeding in Lebanon.

OMAN

It seems that Sooty Shearwaters Puffinus griseus may occur more regularly than had been previously thought off the coast of Oman, mainly in spring; this year there were two records, one off Muscat on 30 May and one off Mirbat in the south on 5 Jun (9th and 10th records respectively). The Black Storks Ciconia nigra seen at Khor Rouri in December were still present in January and had increased to a record nine on 23 Jan. One was also seen in the north at Quriyat on 11 and 24 Jan (8th record). A single Abdim's Stork C. abdimii was at Mughsayl on 24 Jan. A flock of 500 Western White Storks C. ciconia were at Raysut near Salalah on 1 Feb. African Spoonbill Platalea leucorodia is a very rare visitor to southern Oman and one at West Khor, Salalah on 1 May is only the 5th record and the first since 2004. Some of the birds from the influx of Greater White-fronted Geese Anser albifrons noted in November/December remained in the area-there were six at West Khor, Salalah on 9 and 24 Jan, four at Salalah nature reserve on 24 Jan and one at Mughsayl on the same day. Three were at Qurm park on 1 Feb and seven there on 14 Feb. Seven dead birds were found at Montasar and two at Qitbit on 23 Jan (presumably from the flock of 50 seen in the area in December). **Red-crested Pochard** *Netta rufina* is an uncommon passage migrant and winter visitor so a pair at Qurm park on 18 Jan and at Seeb (possibly the same birds) on 4 Feb is interesting. A single Ferruginous Duck Aythya nyroca at Al Lansab on 8 Feb and eight at Mughsayl on 24 Jan are the only records. A single Black Kite Milvus migrans was at Qurivat on 17 Apr. If accepted, a single Lesser Spotted Eagle Aquila pomarina at Khor Rouri on 11 Jan will be the 10th record. Another large count of Steppe Eagles A. nipalensis wintering at Raysut rubbish dump was made on 24 Jan (500). A single Sooty Falcon Falco concolor at Qurm park on 19 Apr was an early record. A White-breasted Waterhen Amaurornis phoenicurus was at Oitbit on 24 Jan, the 2nd record this winter. Two Eurasian Stone-curlews Burhinus oedicnemus were at Dawkah on 24 Apr. It seems that two, possibly three, pairs of Spotted Thick-knees Burhinus capensis bred in Salalah, eggs and chicks being found in April. Five

adult Sociable Lapwings Vanellus gregaria were at Sahanawt farm, Salalah, on 19 Feb. There was an unusual record of a single Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus at Qitbit in the central desert on 24-25 Apr. A Long-tailed Skua Stercorarius longicaudus was seen off Muscat on 30 May, the 6th record. A single Red Turtle Dove Streptopelia tranquebarica was at Sun Farms, Sohar on 1 Feb, the 4th record for Oman. Alpine Swift *Apus melba* is a rare and irregular visitor so a single at Muscat on 19 Jan is noteworthy. There are no previous records of Grey-headed Kingfisher Halcyon leucocephala in January so one at Salalah on 9 Jan is interesting. There have been comparatively few records of large numbers of European Rollers Coracias garrulus in recent years, so 60 at Mabr Farm on 23 Apr and 30 at nearby Haima on 25 Apr are of note. There was a single Eurasian Crag Martin *Ptyonoprogne rupestris* at Montasar on 23 Apr. Red-rumped Swallow Hirundo daurica, while not rare, is not seen frequently so one at Sohar Sun Farms on 2 Apr is interesting. A single male Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava of the race taivana was at Barka rubbish tip on 7 Feb and would be the 3rd record if accepted. There have been comparatively few records of Song Thrush Turdus philomelos this winter but one was at Mabr farm on 20 Mar and one at Wadi Rawnub on the same day. There was a good passage of migrants though the central desert on 23-24 Apr with 10 European Reed Warblers Acrocephalus scirpaceus and 50 Eastern Olivaceous Warblers Iduna pallida pallida being seen at Mabr farm. Nile Valley Sunbird Anthodiaeta metallica is a rare breeder in southern Oman but eight were seen at Tudho including a pair at the nest with one chick on 27 Mar. Purple Sunbird Cinnyris asiaticus is very rare in southern Oman so a single female at Qitbit on 24 Jan is noteworthy. A single Masked Shrike Lanius nubicus was seen in a small garden just north of Haima on 25 Apr. House Crows Corvus splendens have been increasing in numbers in the Raysut area near Salalah but two at East Khor on 5 Jun are the first records for this area—a worrying but not unexpected development. Spanish **Sparrow** *Passer hispaniolensis* is a rare passage migrant and winter visitor but there were three at Qurm park on 9 Jan, four on 14 Mar and two on 19 Apr. A flock of 50 **Pale Rockfinches** *Petronia brachydactyla* was seen at Sohar Sun Farms on 2 Apr and five were at Yalooni on 17 Apr.

QATAR

A really surprising record was that of two Whooper Swans Cygnus cygnus which flew low over Makhenis farm on 9 Feb. Having flown north over the site they headed back out into the desert. Two Zitting Cisticolas Cisticola juncidis were reported from Abu Nakhla ponds (formerly called the Jail ponds) on 5 Feb-a new bird for Qatar. A count of 1050 Grev Herons Ardea cinerea at Abu Nakhla ponds on 5 Feb was impressive, although not unusual. Two Greater Whitefronted Geese Anser albifrons were seen on 10 Feb, as were 34 Ferruginous Ducks Aythya nyroca. A Jack Snipe Lymnocryptes minimus was at Al Khor community sewage ponds on 7-8 Feb. Greater Short-toed Larks Calandrella brachydactyla included a flock of at least 300 on the north coast around Ras Raffan/Um Tees on 8 Feb. There were 2680 Socotra Cormorants Leucocarbo nigrogularis at Wakira beach on 9 Feb, and also that day, two Redtailed Wheatears Oenanthe chrysopygia at Makhenis farm.

SYRIA

Four Northern Bald Ibises Geronticus eremita returned to the breeding cliffs near Palmyra and hatched four young, none of which fledged; the cause has been ascribed to the extremely dry spring. Two immatures returned later in the season. Six See-see Partridges Ammoperdix griseogularis were at Lake Khatuniyah (al-Hawl Lake) in the Jazira on 27 Feb. A flock of 40 Glossy Ibises Plegadis falcinellus flew over Mheimideh in April, the biggest group for many years. At least eight Lesser Kestrels Falco naumanni had returned to their breeding cliffs in the Euphrates valley on 25 Feb. A Spotted Crake Porzana porzana and a Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus were reported from the Palmyra area in April. Over 100 Sociable Lapwings Vanellus gregarius were seen at four sites in the north and east in late February; some were feeding and others clearly migrating north. A Red-wattled Plover Vanellus indicus and 25 White-tailed Plovers V.

leucurus were at Mheimideh on 25-27 Feb with two Little Crakes Porzana parva on 28 Feb. At Sabkhat al-Jabbul on 23 Feb there were 84 Eurasian Spoonbills Platalea leucorodia, 12 White-headed Ducks Oxyura leucocephala, five species of tern Sterna/Chlidonias, a Whitebreasted Kingfisher Halcyon smyrnensis (possibly a new site for this species), 20 Stock Doves Columba oenas and six Pallid Swifts Avus vallidus, but no definite Lesser Whitefronted Geese Anser erythropus. Three Stock Doves were also near Hasakeh on 27 Feb; this species is now rarely seen in Syria. A flock of seven Namagua Doves Oena capensis at Palmyra in May is the biggest group reported so far from Syria. Three flocks of Little Swift Apus affinis totalling 35 birds passed over Sed Wadi Abied on 24 May; this is a good site for the species, which is likely to breed nearby but there have been no confirmed breeding records yet from Syria. Three Common Swifts Apus apus were in the Euphrates valley on 25 Feb. Isabelline Shrikes Lanius i. isabellinus were at Jabbul on 23 Feb and at Mheimideh on 28 Feb; typical dates for this species. However, another Isabelline Shrike at Talila on 23 May was unusually late. The cold winter may have accounted for the observations of good numbers of thrushes Turdus spp rarely seen in Syria; up to 15 Fieldfares Turdus pilaris were in the Euphrates valley on 25 Feb with 85 at Bloudan on 2 Mar and two Mistle Thrushes Turdus viscivorus in the Euphrates valley from 24-25 Feb. A Cyprus Wheatear Oenanthe cypriaca was at Talila on 1 Mar. This species is probably a regular passage migrant. A Paddyfield Warbler Acrocephalus agricola at Sed Wadi Abied on 24 May is the first Syrian record. A Clamorous Reed Warbler A. stentoreus was reported singing at Mheimideh in April. Two White-eared Bulbuls Pycnonotus leucotis were at Mheimideh on 28 Feb with six at the usual site in Deir ez-Zor. Seven Pine Buntings Emberiza leucocephalus were at Bloudan on 2 Mar, the 2nd Syrian record. Also there were 85 Fieldfares, 40 Bramblings Fringilla montifringilla and at least 20 Yellowhammers Emberiza citronella. This is probably a regular wintering site for these buntings as they were seen at the same site in March 2007. Winter trips to Syria might be very exciting as species such as Pine Bunting *Emberiza leucocephalos,* **Radde's Accentor** *Prunellus ocularis* and **Red-fronted Serin** *Serinus pusillus* may winter in the mountains and **Lesser White-fronted Goose**, bustards Otididae spp, **Eurasian Dotterel** *Charadrius morinellus*, **Twite** *Carduelis flavirostris* and **Crimson-winged Finch** *Rhodopechys sanguinea* may be in steppe areas.

TURKEY

Two Red-breasted Geese Branta ruficollis were at Büyükçekmece Lake, İstanbul on 10 Jan and five were reported from Kuyucuk Lake, Kars on 28 Apr, a very late date. A total of 25 Bewick's Swans Cygnus bewickii were at Enez, Edirne, on 26 Jan and 180 were in the Kızılırmak Delta on 22 Jan. It was a good period for wintering seaduck with seven Greater Scaups Aythya marila in the Yeşilırmak Delta on 19 Jan and one at Enez on 26 Jan, three **Common Eiders** Somateria mollissima in the Sakarya-Karasu on 20 Jan, seven Common Scoters Melanitta nigra in the Kızılırmak Delta on 22 Feb and a Long-tailed Duck Clangula hyemalis at İğneada on 16 Jan. A single Redthroated Diver Gavia stellata was at Balıkesir on 1 Jan and there was a high count of 65 in the Kızılırmak Delta on 22 Feb. A Horned Grebe Podiceps auritus was at Sarıyar Dam, north of Ankara, on 27 Jan. There was an exceptionally high, and early, count of 200 Black Storks Ciconia nigra at Haliç, İstanbul on 27 Feb. Two Northern Gannets Morus bassanus were offshore between Hatay and Samandağ on 1 Jan and two were at Kadıköy, Istanbul on 7 May. Four White-tailed Eagles Haliaetus albicilla were at Sarıyar Dam on 27 Jan, there was a *fulvescens*-type Greater Spotted Eagle Aquila clanga at Terkos lake, Istanbul on 2 Feb and a Steppe Eagle Aquila nipalensis at Ceylanpinar on 24 Mar. A **Corncrake** Crex crex was in Çaycuma, Zonguldak on 19 May and four Demoiselle Cranes Anthropoides virgo were in the Kızılırmak Delta on 23 May. A single Greater Sand Plover Charadrius leschenaultii was at Çaycuma on 10 May, two were at Kuyucuk Lake on 5 May and one in the Kızılırmak Delta on 11 May. There appears to have been a good spring passage of Eurasian Dotterels Charadrius morinellus this spring with a minimum of 206 near Kulu on 23 Mar and 23 in

Ceylanpinar on 24 Mar. This species is almost certainly under-recorded. A Great Snipe Gallinago media was in the Kızılırmak Delta on 31 May. Six Broad-billed Sandpipers Limocola falcinellus in the Gediz Delta on 27 Jan was an interesting winter record and there was a good spring passage with 200 reported from Akcakale, Cevlanpinar on 1 Mar and about 50 in the Kızılırmak Delta on 11 May. Single Black-legged Kittiwakes Rissa tridactyla were seen in the Gediz Delta and at Foça, İzmir on 4 Feb and in the Kızılırmak Delta on 3 May. Six Little Swifts Apus affinis in Subaşı, Antakya on 13 Jan, with three on 4 Feb, were unusual winter records. A total of 11 Bluecheeked Bee-eaters Merops persicus in the Kızılırmak Delta on 31 May was the 1st record for the site and six were at Kuyucuk Lake on 18 May. An Isabelline Shrike Lanius isabellinus was reported from the Gediz Delta on 19 Jan. A Citrine Wagtail Motacilla citreola at Nizip, Gaziantep, on 27 Jan was an interesting record. Yet another Pine Bunting Emberiza leucocephala was recorded, this time from Büyükçekmece Lake on 10 Jan, and there was a Rustic Bunting Emberiza rustica at Sakarya-Karasu on 18 Jan.

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES

There were up to six Sooty Shearwaters Puffinus griseus off Fujairah in May. This species is now seemingly a regular bird off the east coast in late spring. A Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus was in Abu Dhabi on Marbled Jan. UAE's 4th Duck 26 Marmaronetta angustirostris was at Khor al Beida on 1 Feb and the 8th-10th records of Red-crested Pochard Netta rufina were six at Dubai Pivots on 20 Jan and 2 Feb, up to three at Al Wathba from 22-26 Jan and another in Al Ain from 1 Feb-14 Mar. A White-breasted Waterhen Amaurornis phoenicurus was at Emirates Golf Course on 22 Jan. The longstaying **Red-knobbed Coot** Fulica cristata was recorded up to 23 Mar, and hybrid birds were also seen. A Lesser Yellowlegs Tringa flavipes present in Al Ain from 28 Nov 2007 until 23 Apr was the first for the UAE, while a Rednecked Stint Calidris ruficollis at Fujairah on 19 May was the 7th record, and a Red Phalarope Phalaropus fulicaria at Al Wathba Lake on 18 Jan was the 3rd record. An immature Mediterranean Gull Larus melanocephalus at Mafrag on 13 Feb was the 7th record. Single Common Gulls L. canus were at Ras al Khor from 31 Dec 2007 to 1 Jan, Creekside Park 20 Jan, Al Wathba 31 Jan-29 Feb and at Al Warsan on 7 Mar. A Black Tern Chlidonias niger was at Al Wathba from 2-22 Feb. A Sykes's Nightjar Caprimulgus mahrattensis at the Fujairah Dairy Farm from 20 Dec 2007 until 23 Jan was the 4th record. A Great Spotted Cuckoo Clamator glandarius in Al Ain (Jebel Hafit) from 14-21 Mar was the first record. The UAE's 5th Streak-throated Swallow Petrochelidon fluvicola was in Al Ain from 4-20 Feb with another at Al Warsan Lakes on 5 Feb. Two Brown-throated Martins *Riparia paludicola* were in Al Ain from 2–6 Feb, and a scattering of **Pale Martins** *R. diluta* were reported. An Asian House Martin Delichon dasypus in Al Ain from 6–8 Mar was the 3rd record. A Forest Wagtail Dendronanthus indicus was in Abu Dhabi from 12-19 Jan and up to three Buff-bellied Pipits Anthus rubescens were at Dubai Pivot Fields up to 23 Mar. A **Dark-throated Thrush** *Turdus atrogularis* was in Al Ain on 29 Feb. A Moustached Warbler Acrocephalus melanopogon was at Al Wathba from 6–12 Jan, while a Booted Warbler Iduna caligata was in Abu Dhabi on 24 Apr. A Hume's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus humei in Abu Dhabi from 8–11 Jan was followed by two in Ruwais from 11 Jan-7 Feb. A Dusky Warbler Phylloscopus fuscatus in Abu Dhabi from 30 Mar-15 Apr was possibly the same bird as seen there in December 2007. Up to 67 Hypocoliuses Hypocolius ampelinus were at Ghantoot in February. An Ashy Drongo Dicrurus leucophaeus in Al Ain from 29 Feb-20 Mar was the 2nd record for the UAE and the Western Palearctic. A Brambling Fringilla montifringilla was at Al Wathba on 11 Jan and 8 Mar.

UZBEKISTAN

An OSME-supported expedition to the Ayak-Agitma wetland in the Kyzylkum desert north of Bukhara took place from 15 Apr–5 May. While the trip was unsuccessful in finding migrant Slender-billed Curlews Numenius tenuirostris, it collected a great deal of new information from this little known region. Interesting records included up to eight Common Goldeneyes Bucephala clangula between 26–29 Apr, single Smew Mergellus albellus on 26 and 27 Apr, two Red-breasted Mergansers Mergus serrator on 26 Apr, a single Black-throated Diver Gavia arctica on 29 Apr and 4 May (presumably present throughout), eight Horned Grebes Podiceps auritus on 29 Apr, a single Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus on 2 May and four Bar-tailed Godwits Limosa lapponica on 4 May.

YEMEN

High numbers of African species were recorded during the last two weeks of January: 12 **Black-headed Herons** *Ardea melanocephala* (six at Al Hodeidah SF and six near Aden), a flock of 237 **Abdim's Storks** *Ciconia abdimii* on Aden rubbish dump on 28 Jan, and about 2200 **Lesser Flamingos** *Phoenicopterus minor* at Al Hodeidah SF, with around 1700 at Aden fishponds. There were 17 **Sacred Ibises** *Threskiornis aethiopicus* at Aden fish-ponds on 28 Jan, and in June three pairs were found breeding at Aden.
